Squamish Champions: Your town is a Bear Smartcertified community.

What does it mean to be Bear Smart?

Human-wildlife conflicts arise when people allow bears/wildlife to access non-natural food sources. When bears gain access to human food, garbage and other attractants, they become food-conditioned and human-habituated.

This poses an increased risk to public safety, and ultimately can mean a tragic outcome for the bear. Being Bear Smart means that we recognize our roles and responsibilities in living with wildlife and make community-wide efforts to reduce human-wildlife conflicts.

The Ministry of Environment provided this accreditation to the District in 2010 with Squamish being the 2nd community in BC to receive such certification. This means we do things a bit differently and have a higher level of care when it comes to reducing conflicts between humans and wildlife.







Squamish is Bear Smart

The District of Squamish is a Bear Smart certified community.

What you can do as a business owner in Squamish:

- Store and secure all wildlife attractants.
- Lock and secure garbage and organics totes with both locks always, even when empty. Never place totes curbside the night before, even if locked.
- Lock and secure garbage and organic dumpsters always. Ensure staff are educated and on-board.
